The contest is open to amateur cooks ages 18 years and older who currently reside in the Washington DC metropolitan area. The contest will include a panel of special guest judges including **Joan Nathan**, a James Beard Award winner, author of 10 cookbooks and host of the PBS television series *Jewish Cooking in America with Joan Nathan*; **Brenda Rhodes Miller**, author of two books, including *The Church Ladies' Divine Desserts*; **Lauren de Santis**, producer/host "Capital Cooking"; **Andy Shallal**, owner of Eatonville Restaurant; **Scott Schenkelberg**, Executive Director of Miriam's Kitchen. Additional judges will be announced.

The Makes-Me-Wanna-SHOUT! Coconut Cake Challenge will benefit **Miriam's Kitchen** (www.miriamskitchen.org), a non-profit organization that provides meals and support services to homeless men and women. In 2010, Miriam's Kitchen served over 75,000 healthy meals and provided case management services to 3,000 men and women.

Eatonville Restaurant, "The Soul of Southern Food," was opened in 2009 by Andy Shallal, founder of Busboys and Poets.
